## I. Introduction

1. The Conference on Disarmament submits to the eightieth session of the General Assembly of the United Nations its annual report on its 2025 session, together with the pertinent documents and records.

## II. Organization of the work of the Conference

### A. 2025 session of the Conference

2. The Conference was in session from 20 January to 28 March, 12 May to 27 June and 28 July to 12 September 2025. During this period, the Conference held 29 formal plenary meetings, at which member States outlined their views and recommendations on the various issues before the Conference.

3. The Conference also held 2 informal plenary meetings.

4. The Presidency was assumed in accordance with rule 9 of the Rules of Procedure, as specified in Appendix I to this report.

5. At the 1740th plenary meeting, held on 30 January 2025, Ms. Tatiana Valovaya, Secretary-General of the Conference on Disarmament and Personal Representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations, addressed the Conference (CD/PV.1740). The Secretary-General of the United Nations, Mr. António Guterres, addressed the Conference on Disarmament on 24 February 2025 (CD/PV.1747).

6. Upon the joint invitation, by a letter dated 17 January 2025, of the first President of the Conference, Mr. Leonardo Bencini, Ambassador and Permanent Representative of Italy to the Conference on Disarmament, and the Secretary-General of the Conference on Disarmament and Personal Representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations, 58 dignitaries representing member States as well as States not members of the Conference and organs of the United Nations system invited to participate in the work of the Conference delivered high-level statements to the Conference during the week of 24 February, as reflected in CD/PV.1746, CD/PV.1747, CD/PV.1748, CD/PV.1749 and CD/PV.1750.

7. The substantive Secretariat of the Conference on Disarmament was composed as follows: Ms. Tatiana Valovaya, Secretary-General of the Conference on Disarmament and Personal Representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations; Ms. C. Mélanie Régimbal, Deputy Secretary-General of the Conference and Chief of Service of the Geneva Branch, United Nations Office for Disarmament Affairs; Mr. Michael Spies, Senior Political Affairs Officer; Ms. Jungmin Yeo, Political Affairs Officer; Ms. Alice Marzi, Associate Political Affairs Officer; Ms. Ariana Smith, Associate Political Affairs Officer; and Mr. Boaz Ho, Associate Political Affairs Officer.

### B. Participants in the work of the Conference

8. The representatives of the following 65 member States participated in the work of the Conference: Algeria, Argentina, Australia, Austria, Bangladesh, Belarus, Belgium, Brazil, Bulgaria, Cameroon, Canada, Chile, China, Colombia, Cuba, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Ecuador, Egypt, Ethiopia, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, India, Indonesia, Iran (Islamic Republic of), Iraq, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Japan, Kazakhstan, Kenya, Malaysia, Mexico, Mongolia, Morocco, Myanmar, Netherlands (Kingdom of the), New Zealand, Nigeria, Norway, Pakistan, Peru, Poland, Republic of Korea, Romania, Russian Federation, Senegal, Slovakia, South Africa, Spain, Sri Lanka, Sweden, Switzerland, Syrian Arab Republic, Tunisia, Türkiye, Ukraine, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America, Venezuela (Bolivarian Republic of), Viet Nam and Zimbabwe.

### C. Attendance and participation of States not members of the Conference

9. In accordance with the rules of procedure and the decision taken at its 1990 session on its improved and effective functioning (CD/1036), the Conference received 32 requests for participation in its work as contained in CD/WP.666\*, CD/WP.666/Add.1, CD/WP.666/Add.2, CD/WP.666/Add.3 and CD/WP.666/Add.4. Delegations expressed their views on this matter during the formal meetings.

10. In response to the requests for participation, the Conference invited the following non-member States to participate in its work: Armenia, Cote d'Ivoire, Dominican Republic, Georgia, Guatemala, Holy See, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Panama, Philippines, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Serbia, Thailand, and United Arab Emirates. The Conference did not reach agreement on the other requests to participate in the work of the Conference. The views and positions of delegations are duly reflected in the relevant plenary meeting records. Decisions on this matter are reflected in CD/PV.1739, CD/PV.1740, CD/PV.1741, CD/PV.1742 and CD/PV.1745.

### D. Agenda and programme of work for the 2025 session

11. At its 1737th plenary meeting on 21 January 2025, a draft agenda was presented by the first President of the Conference and reviewed in accordance with rule 29 of the rules of procedure. The Conference on Disarmament adopted the following agenda (CD/2442) for the 2025 session (CD/PV.1737):

“Taking into account, inter alia, the relevant provisions of the Final Document of the First Special Session of the General Assembly devoted to disarmament, and deciding to resume its consultations on the review of its agenda, and without prejudice to their outcome, the Conference adopts the following agenda for its 2025 session:

1. Cessation of the nuclear arms race and nuclear disarmament.
2. Prevention of nuclear war, including all related matters.
3. Prevention of an arms race in outer space.
4. Effective international arrangements to assure non-nuclear-weapon States against the use or threat of use of nuclear weapons.
5. New types of weapons of mass destruction and new systems of such weapons; radiological weapons.
6. Comprehensive programme of disarmament.
7. Transparency in armaments.
8. Consideration and adoption of the annual report and any other report, as appropriate, to the General Assembly of the United Nations.”

12. The first President of the Conference made the following statement: “In connection with the adoption of the agenda, I, as the President of the Conference, should like to state that it is my understanding that if there is a consensus in the Conference to deal with any issues, they could be dealt with within this agenda. The Conference will also take into consideration rules 27 and 30 of the rules of procedure of the Conference.”

13. At the 1740th plenary meeting on 30 January 2025, the Conference adopted decision CD/2443, submitted by the first President of the Conference, which reads as follows:

“The Conference on Disarmament,

*In pursuance* of its agenda contained in CD/2442,

*Recalling* decisions CD/2390 and CD/2391 on the work of the Conference on Disarmament for 2024,

*Recalling* the reports of the subsidiary bodies on their work during the 2024 session of the Conference on Disarmament, [CD/2392](#), [CD/2393](#), [CD/2394](#), [CD/2395](#), [CD/2396](#), adopted by the Conference on 15 August 2024,

*Decides:*

(a) To reestablish, in accordance with rule 23 of its Rules of Procedure, four Subsidiary Bodies on agenda items 1 to 4, and a fifth Subsidiary Body on agenda items 5, 6 and 7, to resume their work in accordance with the mandate and the organizational and procedural modalities specified in decision [CD/2390](#);

(b) To reappoint, on the basis of equitable geographic distribution, the following coordinators of the Subsidiary Bodies to continue their functions:

Subsidiary body 1: Cessation of the nuclear arms race and nuclear disarmament  
Mr. Angel HORNA of Peru

Subsidiary body 2: Prevention of nuclear war, including all related matters  
H.E. Mr. Julien THÖNI, Ambassador of Switzerland

Subsidiary body 3: Prevention of an arms race in outer space  
H.E. Mr. Carlos Mario FORADORI, Ambassador of Argentina

Subsidiary body 4: Effective international arrangements to assure non-nuclear weapon States against the use or threat of use of nuclear weapons  
Mr. Mohamed Gamal Ahmed ELGHITANY of Egypt

Subsidiary body 5: New types of weapons of mass destruction and new systems of such weapons; radiological weapons - Comprehensive programme of disarmament - Transparency in armaments  
Mr. Nikola YAKOV of Bulgaria

(c) That the subsidiary bodies will meet in accordance with the timetable annexed to this decision.”

## **E. Expansion of the membership of the Conference**

14. The question of the expansion of the membership of the Conference was addressed by delegations in plenary meetings. Their views on the issue are duly reflected in the plenary records.

15. Since 1982, requests for membership have been received from the following 28 non-members, in chronological order: Greece, Croatia, Kuwait, Portugal, Slovenia, Czech Republic, Costa Rica, Denmark, North Macedonia, Cyprus, Lithuania, Ghana, Luxembourg, Uruguay, Philippines, Azerbaijan, Libya, Armenia, Thailand, Georgia, Jordan, Estonia, Latvia, Malta, Serbia, Republic of Moldova, Qatar and Saudi Arabia.

## **F. Review of the agenda of the Conference**

16. The review of the agenda of the Conference was addressed by delegations in plenary meetings. The first President of the Conference noted the proposal for including a new item on the agenda, as contained in document [CD/2450](#). Relevant records are mentioned in [CD/PV.1737](#).

23. During the general debate of the Conference, delegations reaffirmed or further elaborated their respective positions on this agenda item. These positions are duly recorded in the plenary records of the session.

In accordance with the timetable annexed to decision [CD/2443](#), Subsidiary Body 1, Cessation of the nuclear arms race and nuclear disarmament, held informal meetings on 4 February (morning), 11 March (morning), 13 March (morning and afternoon), 27 May (morning), 28 May (morning) and 29 July (morning and afternoon).

In discharging his mandate, the Coordinator held a number of bilateral and open-ended consultations with members of the Conference on the draft report of Subsidiary Body 1 and informed the Conference on the outcomes of those consultations at the plenary meeting held on 2 September ([CD/PV.1762](#)). The subsidiary body extensively discussed areas of possible convergence related to the possible future work of the subsidiary body, bearing in mind the role of the Conference on Disarmament as the single multilateral disarmament negotiating forum of the international community.

**G. Consideration and adoption of the annual report of the Conference and any other report as appropriate to the General Assembly of the United Nations**

45. Bearing in mind its role as the single multilateral disarmament negotiating forum, building on the decisions on the work of the Conference on Disarmament for 2024<sup>1</sup> and 2025<sup>2</sup> and with a view to the early resumption of substantive work during its 2026 session, in accordance with its rules of procedure, the Conference requested the current President and the incoming President to conduct consultations during the intersessional period and, if possible, make recommendations taking into account all relevant proposals, past, present and future, including those submitted as documents of the Conference on Disarmament, views presented and discussions held, and to endeavour to keep the membership of the Conference informed, as appropriate, of their consultations.

46. The Member States that are next in order of rotation to assume the Presidencies in 2026 in accordance with rule 9 of the Rules of Procedure are indicated in Appendix III to this report.

47. The Conference decided that the dates for its 2026 session would be:

First part: 19 January – 27 March

Second part: 11 May – 26 June

Third part: 27 July – 11 September

48. The annual report to the eightieth session of the General Assembly of the United Nations, as adopted by the Conference on 10 September 2025, is transmitted by the President on behalf of the Conference on Disarmament.
