
Dear Sir,

"La tâche primordiale des médecins consiste dans le maintien de la santé et la promotion de la survie de l'espèce humaine. La probabilité toujours croissante d'un conflit nucléaire oblige le corps médical à redéfinir son rôle dans la prévention de ce qui fut appelé 'l'ultime épidémie'..." (The New England Journal of Medicine, mars 1981)

La surenchère nucléaire, à laquelle se livrent, depuis SALT II, les deux blocs militaires sur le continent européen ravive sans aucun doute un profond souci de paix dans nos populations, ceci d'autant plus que les militaires discutent ouvertement les avantages tactiques d'une guerre nucléaire 'limitée'.

Dans un certain nombre de pays les responsables politiques poussent le cynisme jusqu'à faire croire qu'en cas d'attaque nucléaire, la population atteinte pourrait être secourue efficacement grâce à l'existence d'un plan anticatastrophe mobilisant toutes les ressources médicales.

Un éditorial du New England Journal of Medicine de 1962 montre sans équivoque quelle sera l'impuissance des survivants du corps médical devant l'immensité de la tâche médicale après l'explosion de deux bombes atomiques en milieu urbain (Boston).

Face à la probabilité toujours croissante d'un conflit nucléaire, la seule attitude logique est de tout mettre en oeuvre pour **L' E M P Ê C H E R** de se produire plutôt que d'essayer de parer à ses conséquences.

Dans cette lutte pour la survie, le médecin, habitué à rendre intelligible à ses malades des faits scientifiques souvent complexes, est comme prédestiné à expliquer à la population les conséquences d'une guerre nucléaire en relevant le fait qu'aucun plan anticatastrophe, si bien agencé fût-il, ne saurait rendre acceptable à la population civile le risque nucléaire.

STATEMENT BY THE INTERNATIONAL PHYSICIANS FOR THE PREVENTION OF NUCLEAR WAR
TO THE PARTICIPANTS IN THE SECOND SPECIAL SESSION OF THE UNITED NATIONS
GENERAL ASSEMBLY DEVOTED TO DISARMAMENT

The growing threat of thermonuclear war and the continued development and proliferation of nuclear weapons have compelled us as physicians to examine in detail the consequences such a war would have on the people of our nations and of the world, whose health and survival are our professional commitment.

During the past several days, physicians and scientists from 31 countries have gathered to consider relevant data on the immediate and long term effects of a nuclear conflict. We were unanimous in concluding that:

1) Nuclear war would be a catastrophe for any country and any people against whom those weapons were used. In the nations directly attacked, tens to hundreds of millions of people would be killed instantly. Millions of those residing in nations not directly attacked would also perish. There is no possibility of an effective medical response in the ensuing chaos. From the medical standpoint alone, the terms "limited" and "winning" have no meaning in the context of nuclear war.

2) Among those who might survive the initial effects of blast, fire, and radiation, many would face the prospect of prolonged agony and slow death. Untold numbers would succumb to injuries for which no adequate medical treatment could be provided. Widespread starvation, epidemics, and psychological stress would be inevitable.

Radioactive contamination would spread to vast areas and would pollute the biosphere. The natural protective ozone layer around the earth might be damaged, with unpredictable consequences to all forms of life and to the very survival of the human species. At the very least, the social, cultural, environmental and medical damage in the aftermath of a nuclear war would persist for generations.

3) Nuclear war in Europe would destroy at a stroke its civilisation and the achievements of thousands of years of human effort.

4) Since physicians would have no remedy for the foreseeable medical consequences of a nuclear war, the only effective action is prevention.

Mounting military expenditures and the intensification of the arms race heighten tension. Each new crisis worsens the threat of nuclear war. No matter how difficult the international problems facing the world today, there is no acceptable alternative to their resolution through serious and honest negotiations based upon realistic assessments and mutual respect, with account being taken of the security of all states. The imperative of our time is to rule out the very idea of the use of nuclear weapons, in any form or on any scale. Ultimately, nuclear weapons must be destroyed before they destroy humanity.

The growth in sheer numbers of nuclear weapons and the increasing complexity and sophistication of delivery systems increase the possibility that a nuclear conflict may be triggered by tragic accident.

Physicians are aware from their daily work that technological systems are liable to malfunction and that human performance may fail because of mental derangement or even simple error. Whereas such failures in medicine may jeopardize a single life, the malfunctioning of military systems may now endanger the existence of humanity.

The arms race is killing people now by diverting scarce resources from urgent human needs. We therefore urge that measures be taken to reduce military budgets and to channel part of the funds thus released to improve living standards and to relieve the condition of millions of people who suffer from lack of food and housing, from poor sanitation, and from widespread but preventable disease.

We believe that action must be taken now to prevent nuclear war and to relieve these consequences of the arms race. We urge that as a first step, the nuclear powers cease all production, testing, and deployment of nuclear weapons and their delivery systems. This should be accompanied by mutually acceptable methods of verification. We advocate effective bilateral and multilateral negotiations on the limitation, reduction, and ultimate elimination of nuclear weapons.

We are aware that negotiations have been in progress for many years with no apparent effect on the arms race. While we welcome any initiative by either side to reduce its stock of nuclear weapons, we recognize that they are likely to be eliminated only by negotiation. We must again urge that such negotiation be pursued seriously and continuously until they succeed.

As physicians committed to the preservation of health and life for all, we are eager to share our medical and scientific studies in every way that might help to reduce the threat of nuclear war. Should the Second Special Session of the United Nations General Assembly Devoted to Disarmament find it useful, representatives of IPPNW would be pleased to present data on the medical consequences of the arms race and nuclear war.

Only the reversal of the arms race can ensure the security of the planet as a whole.
