Dear Mr. President:

The Miami Archdiocesan Council of Catholic Women incorporates 8 counties in South Florida and has a membership of 8300 ladies. At the 24th annual convention held at the Hyatt-Palm Beaches in May of this year the following resolution was voted on and adopted.

RESOLUTION ON DISARMAMENT

RESOLVED That the Miami Archdiocesan Council of Catholic Women affirm the statement of Pope John Paul II on August 20, 1981: "Let us promise each other that we will work tirelessly for disarmament and the abolition of all nuclear weapons," and be it further

RESOLVED That the Miami Archdiocesan Council of Catholic Women ask that all nations limit nuclear arms and work towards the outlawing of nuclear weaponry and all forms of germ and chemical warfare, and be it further

RESOLVED That this resolution be sent to the President of the United States, the Secretary General of the United Nations with copies to all member nations.

As you have read I am, as the Resolution Committee Chairman, sending a copy of the resolution to Secretary-General Javier Perez de Cuellar and all member nation representatives of the United Nations.
