Regional Models importance in Enhancing The Draft Final Report

Moreover, and as multilateral cyber discussions progress, it’s clear that a Regional adaptable Model that is rooted in inclusion, Collaboration and measurable execution are key to turning the Draft Final report from vision into reality

While the draft sets forth inclusive, multi-stakeholder engagement as a guiding principle, its successful operationalization depends on existing models that are already achieving meaningful impact in regions where diversity, workforce development, and digital resilience are both urgent and crucial.

One such Model is Women in Cyber Security Middle East (WiCSME). With broad reach across MENA and active collaborations spanning civil society, regulators, academia, and industry, WiCSME offers a working Blueprint for implementing the draft recommendations—rooted in cultural context, regional ownership, and proven effectiveness.

WiCSME: A Strategic Blueprint & Enabler

WiCSME is not just a network, it is a global strategic blueprint and a practical playbook for building inclusive digital future. Moreover, WiCSME is a policy-relevant actor bridging gender, skills, and governance gaps across the Globe specially the Global South through its flagship programs and global alliances.

1. Gender-Responsive Capacity Building at Scale

WiCSME delivers outcome-driven, inclusive, and scalable initiatives across MENA, including:

- Launching Pioneering our Regional Capacity Building Program “CyberSHE”, which aligns with National and UN OEWG Targets. The program aims to train up to 1,500 skilled Female Cyber talents across the region over three years. Starting with our first cohort launched in Kuwait.
 - CyberSHE’s structure—4-week immersive bootcamps blending technical skills, soft skills, mentorship, and role-specific certifications—is designed to produce job-ready cyber professionals.

- Collective collaboration with various stakeholders such as academia, industry, regulators, Private Public Sectors. This Initiative serve as a living pilot for national and regional cyber readiness improvement.
- In Strategic partnership with ITU, WiCSME's participants made up one-third of the global cohort in ITU's Women in Cyber Mentorship Program- introducing Arabic content and localized support for the first time.
- IBM SkillsBuild: Over 50 participants completed PBL-based certifications in cybersecurity and AI.
- Bringing more than 250 female speakers last year to global and regional stages, showcasing the region's talent and leadership.
- Serving as a global hub, connecting 18+ Women in Cyber Groups Worldwide, collaborating as a "United Nations of Women in Cyber" to support and amplify impact.

WiCSME's ecosystem also includes forums, awards, research groups, and regional events—all aimed at institutionalizing workforce inclusion, not just offering access. These are not just milestones of representation, they are models of regional ownership, Strategic Execution, and sustained impact (More details on WiCSME various Initiatives are shared in Annexure A available in this document).

2. Inclusion and Voice in Global Policy Platforms

WiCSME meaningfully contributes to global cyber governance through:

- Our Continuous Contributions at UN OEWG: Advanced the voice of Arab women in cyber norms discussions through sharing expertise, knowledge, and Regional Engagements and Success stories.
- Participation in GFCE Summits (Washington D.C., Geneva): Advocated for inclusive workforce models and civil society leadership in capacity building frameworks.
- Global Coalition with 18+ Women in Cyber Groups: A unique, multi-country platform for sharing best practices, co-developing policy templates, and potentially establishing a "United Nations of Women in Cyber Civil Societies"—to replicate success models across continents.

These efforts align with the Chair's calls in the Draft Final Report for a whole-of-society approach and multi-regional leadership in shaping global ICT security dialogues.

3. Operationalizing the Tripartite Model

WiCSME's initiatives already embraces the Industry–Academia–Regulator triad and illustrated how it can function in practice through shared KPIs and Goals—not in theory. For example:

- Industry Partnership: Google, IBM, Zain, KFH, BIG, Deloitte, EC-Council, London Business School and NetLabs contribute tools, Funds raising, Sponsorships, scholarships, labs, and curriculum design for inclusive cyber skilling and capacity building.
- Government and Academia: Regulatory engagement happens through CyberSHE KPIs, national talents training support, and academic partnerships like Kuwait College of Science and Technology (KCST), and Dubai Cyber Innovation Park (DCIP).
- Strategic & Community Partnership: WiCSME partners with Global and Regional leading CyberSecurity forums and Summits (such as ITU, BlackHAT MEA, GISEC, GITEX..etc), to deliver WiCSME members voices and promote their leadership and professional experience.
- Regional and Local WiCSME Chapters Community: WiCSME drives volunteer mentoring, bootcamps, workshops, local chapters, and cross-border knowledge exchange.

CyberSHE is a flagship Pilot of this model in action—fostering co-owned KPIs, localized delivery, and cross-sector investment. It is a blueprint that could be adapted for use in other parts of the Globe specially the Global South.

1. Execution Partner for Strategic Workforce Development: With its growing training footprint, WiCSME can help member states scale gender-inclusive cybersecurity workforce strategies—especially through CyberSHE.
2. Knowledge Exchange Platform: WiCSME's network of over 18 global women's cyber groups could serve as a vehicle for sharing national success stories, enabling cross-border replication of good practices.
3. Policy Innovation Lab: WiCSME could contribute to pilot initiatives for inclusive cyber policy, such as youth engagement, local GCI strategy acceleration, and metrics development for gender participation.
4. Civil Society Focal Point: As a trusted actor in both community and global policy spaces, WiCSME is positioned to amplify grassroots feedback into global norm-setting dialogues.

As the Founding Partner and Board member of Women in CyberSecurity MiddleEast Group and presenting under the Umbrella of Write Pilot, I would like to thank you Chair for this valuable opportunity to hear our voice. I hope you find our success stories and initiatives insightful to learn from, as much as we have learnt from your stellar leadership and member of states insights and discussions in the past couple of days. I thank you for such a outstanding learning experience that will help us indeed in enriching our knowledge to better serve our communities and societies.

Now in addressing the guided question #1, I would like to state the following:

The ‘Women in Cyber Security Middle East’ Group also short for “WiCSME”, was formed in 2018 to promote and increase women’s participation in Cyber Security. It is a Voluntary Group with a vision to build strong, dependable, and a growing network of passionate Female CyberSecurity Professionals in the Middle East and North African countries, and eventually increase the percentage of Women Workforce in the field of Cyber security and encourage for more Female Leadership in Cyber Security in the region.

During these 5 years, WiCSME has built a strong foundation fully in line with our regional culture, religious and societal values and has as a result grown from 9 members to over 1800 members from 23 countries. We have experienced historical moments where we introduced many initiatives to successfully create a platform for our sisters in the region, that is fueled by respect, openness to ideas, constructive feedback, and strive towards excellence.

And in this manner, I would like to bring special attention to the key Capacity Building initiatives and achievements by WiCSME, all of which were firsts in our Middle east region:

1. We are Proud to say that we now have a platform in which Women in CyberSecurity, ‘our young rising stars and experienced professionals’, have equal chance to share their knowledge, have their voices heard and their individual strengths appreciated.
2. We have created opportunities for Our Women to participate alongside their male peers and build their technical, soft and collaborative skills as part of the WiCSME Annual Regional Capture the Flag “CTF” competition. In 2020’s CTF, 36% of the 600 participants were females, and in 2021, we had 63% female participants. This is a double-digit year-on-year growth, which speaks for the impact we are making, while recognizing and managing the challenges that are often faced in a regional setup.
3. For the first time, we introduced a formal way of recognizing, appreciating and showcasing the unique capabilities and contributions of Women in CyberSecurity through the Annual WiCSME Awards – be it in their capacities as leaders in the field, rising stars, or contribution towards their community. We do not only celebrate our Women, but our Male Allies whose support is fundamental in steering this movement forward.

We have felt a tremendous increase in confidence level of our members, who are now taking on bigger and better challenges in their personal and professional lives. They are now transforming from being a follower to a leader, and from setting in the passenger seat to taking the wheel in the driver seat. In doing so, they don't only think about themselves, but also contribute back as Givers to the community in their own unique and talented ways and capacities. They now have a network and Safety Net of like-minded Women to feel confident and to lean on when in a problem or dilemma.

Looking at this congregation here, I feel that we are very similar to the UN in terms of capacity and ethos. We are bringing together our WiCSME affiliate countries towards a common goal. Needless to say, we could not achieve all this without the support from our Partners Of Success. I would like to pay special thanks to Kuwait Foundation for the Advancement of Sciences “KFAS” and the UK-Gulf Women in Cyber Fellowship who have been with us in this journey since the beginning.

While we have achieved so much in a voluntary capacity and contributions from our passionate and brilliant members, we recognize that we now need to build a more formalized and structured framework focused on creating a more sustainable organization which will carry forward the torch of this movement, build the foundation and breath the life to the organization to flourish and create many more historical moments for generations to come.

This will require more collaborative efforts and support from various corners of society – including and not limited to- private and public organizations, governments, academia, and community programs.

It is a moment of pride to be able to state in this global forum and stage that WiCSME has successfully created an Avenue for the Women in CyberSecurity in the MiddleEast, that is nurtured by our Values and Culture, and keen to showcase, foster and celebrate their talents In and Beyond the world of CyberSecurity. We are creating “Leaders” who believe in being ‘Stronger Together’, and “Givers” who actively contribute to our Societies and to the ‘Global Sisterhood of CyberSecurity’.

To conclude, we hope there will be a day where we have a ‘United Nations of Women in Cybersecurity’ that unites these tremendous efforts of various Women in CyberSecurity Groups’ from all over the globe, to collectively support us in achieving The Mission and making A Difference for generations over the World.

This might sound like a big dream and “perhaps, Mr Chair, a bit complicated ingredients for a Smoothie metaphor you had kindly referenced to”, but this dream was envisioned in 2018, and like Denzel Washington once said “Dream Big, but remember that Dreams without Goals are just Dreams, and ultimately they fuel Disappointment. And On the road to achieving these dreams, one’s must apply Discipline but more importantly Consistency.. Because, without Commitment you will never Start, But without Consistency you’ll never Finish’.

Today we are Here and that’s A Start. And Together, by putting collectively Our 3H’s in Action (Our Hearts, Our Heads, and Our Hands), We will hopefully be able to achieve our Goals and Finish. As we are and will always be “StrongerTogether”.

Annexure A: WiCSME Highlights: Measured Impact Through Empowerment & Partnerships

1. Capacity Building and Talent Development

WiCSME continues to foster growth through key initiatives:

- **Regional Capacity Building “CyberSHE” Program** -Women in Cyber Security Middle East (WICSME), under its flagship program, 'She Talks Security', is pioneering a regional training and enablement program called, 'CyberSHE'.
 - The program aims to create capability of up to 1500 trained cyber talents across the Middle East region over a period of 3 years, and it aligns with National and UN OEWG Targets.
 - Collective collaboration with various stakeholders such as academia, industry, regulators, Private Public Sectors. This Initiative serve as a living pilot for national and regional cyber readiness improvement.
 - The program is designed for graduate/senior students with Bachelor/Diploma degrees in Cybersecurity, Computer Engineering, Information Technology or equivalent.
 - The pilot cohort was conducted in Kuwait in May 2025, and is currently targeted to be implemented as “Phase 1” in Oman, Saudi Arabia, and UAE; with an intention to expand to other Arab countries upon successful execution in the target countries.
 - While the program aims to train a minimum of 25 students in one country, a high-level view of the intended target numbers of students it aims to enabled each year across respective countries each year is included in next slide.

- **ITU Women in Cyber Mentorship Program** (UN-affiliated): Being 1st Women in Cyber Group chosen to implement ITU’s Women in Cyber Mentorship Program for the Arab region:
 - Scored highest number of participants as Our 107 Arab region Participants had formed the 1/3 of global participants and had completed a structured 3-month cyber mentorship,
 - Provided Arabic Program’s Contents and Support to break the Language Barrier,
 - Showcased Inspiring Women in Cyber Role model from the Arab region creating deeper and powerful impacts as expressed by the participants in their feedback reports in ITU Program’s Survey.

- **IBM SkillsBuild:** Focused on AI and cybersecurity fundamentals, with 101 participants and 50+ members earned certificates in cybersecurity and AI through 6-week Project-Based Learning courses.
- **Google Certificate Courses (via UdeMy):** Free access extended to all WiCSME members through Years 2024-2025 — promoting digital literacy and career development at scale, and supporting continuous professional upskilling on various Technical and soft skills tracks.
- **Academia Partnerships:** Collaborated with Universities to develop tech and cybersecurity talents.
- **Cyber Aware Culture Campaigns:** Launched a Regional Awareness campaign and webinar in Arabic on cyber-safe families in collaboration with CyberX.
- Conducted Hybrid Regional conferences, with **CTF (Capture The Flag)** female participation growing from 33% to over 60%.

2. Membership and Regional Reach

- Grown from 9 Cofounders in 2018 to nearly **3,000 active members** across **22 countries**, fostering one of the most influential women-in-cyber networks in the Middle East and beyond.
- More than 9 Affiliates (local WiCSME Chapters) are created to arrange and conduct members' local meetups and related activities.

3. Ecosystem Building & Global Alliances

- Launched the **Global Sisterhood Network**, collaborating with 18+ international women-in-cyber groups.
- This Global hub acts as a multi-country platform for sharing best practices, co-developing policy templates, and potentially establishing a “United Nations of Women in Cyber Civil Societies”—to replicate success models across continents.
- Delivered cross-border mentorship, skills exchange, and policy collaboration through strategic partnerships.

4. Expanded Global Visibility

WiCSME has launched impactful programs to empower women in cybersecurity, including strengthening women's representation in cybersecurity by forming Strategic long-term partnerships with global and regional conferences. Below are some examples of these partnerships:

- Global Women in Cyber Central hub: Our Global Sisterhood Network connects 18+ women in cybersecurity groups worldwide and supports collaborative capacity Building initiatives across the globe.
- Global CyberSecurity Women League: Collaborated with Wicked6 for 3 continuous years to enrich the Global CyberSecurity Women League (+23 Speakers from +10 Countries, Advisory board member, Cyber Competitions participants).
- Community Partnership with Global and Regional Leading CyberSecurity Conferences:
 - BlackHat MEA: Increased female speakers from 17 (+5 Countries) in 2022 (@Hack Executive Summit) to 18 (10 countries) in 2023 to 28 (+15 countries) in 2024, breaking global records in highest number of Female Speakers for 3 consecutive years.
 - GISEC & GITEX Conference: Featured 26 female speakers discussing cutting-edge topics from +10 Countries across long-term partnerships.
 - Organized across the region Women in Cyber networking events attended by key Nation's CyberSecurity leaders, reinforcing support for WiCSME's mission.
 - Signed new partnerships with conferences in Seven countries, leading to over 250 female Speakers at global forums in 2024.

5. Global Advocacy

WiCSME contributed to global cyber diplomacy by voicing regional priorities, advocating for inclusive cyber norms, and reinforcing the role of women in shaping international cybersecurity policy. Below are some examples to such contributions by WiCSME Leadership:

- WiCSME Chairperson Dr. Reem AlShammari represented WiCSME at the United Nations Open-Ended Working Group (UN OEWG) on the security of and in the use of ICTs.
- Irene Corpuz (Head of Governance and Strategy, WiCSME) represented WiCSME at GFCE (Global Forum on Cyber Expertise) Summits in Washington, D.C. and Geneva, actively contributing to global capacity-building discussions and highlighting WiCSME's tangible impact on diversity and inclusion in cybersecurity.
- Rising Stars and Younger Generations advocacy: WiCSME Chairperson Dr. Reem AlShammari contributed in Discussions to ITU Regional Arab Development Forums and ITU Girls in Tech Day Events.

6. Breaking Records & Celebrating Excellence (Annual Survey - 2024)

- Making history by securing the highest number of female speakers in various leading global cybersecurity events held in our region—surpassing other regions.
- 250+ female speakers took the stage in 2024, bringing regional expertise to the forefront of international cybersecurity conversations.
- +25 WiCSME members received numerous Global and Regional accolades in Year 2024 alone for example and not limited to:
 - World’s Top 20 Women in Cyber Awards: Eight leaders from six Middle Eastern countries recognized globally forming strong presence of the Middle East (40% of the Top 20 Winners) from around the Globe.
 - GISEC Cyber Excellence Awards, ISC² Global Achievement Award, International Security Journal Influencer, CIO Middle East, CYSEC She Leads Awards..etc, where our WiCSME members are recognized for their outstanding Achievements and Stellar CyberSecurity leadership.
- Achieving Outstanding CyberSecurity Milestones:
 - Passing a Certification Exam: 38 members
 - Receiving a Promotion or better Opportunity: 23 members
 - Completing Academic Degrees: 19 members
 - Publishing Research papers or Books: 14 members

WiCSME continues to shift the cybersecurity narrative — from presence to purpose-driven impact. With representation at UN forums, global partnerships, and outcomes-based programs, it is driving inclusive transformation in the cyber ecosystem across the Middle East and beyond.

WiCSME’s initiatives inspire women to lead and contribute to a more inclusive cybersecurity industry while showcasing Middle Eastern talent on the global stage.
